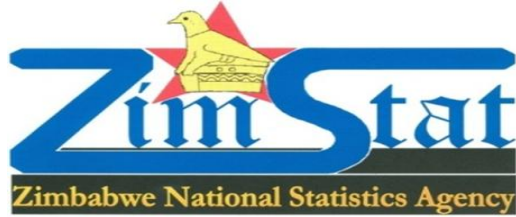

Part 1: Bidding Procedures

1.0 References:

References to the Act are to the Public Procurement and Disposal of Public Assets Act [*Chapter 22:23*] and references to the Regulations are to the Public Procurement and Disposal of Public Assets (General) Regulations (Statutory Instrument No. 5 of 2018). The terms and requirements in the Act and Regulations govern the submission of Bids and should be read by all Bidders.

1.1 Preparation of Bids

You are requested to bid for the supply of the goods specified in the Statement of Requirements below, by completing and returning the following documentation and items:

1. the Bid Submission Sheet in this Part;
2. the Statement of Requirements in Part 2;
3. Brochures of the Conceptual design
4. A copy of every document necessary to demonstrate eligibility in terms of section 28 (1) of the Regulations;
5. Supplier Registration number showing that you are registered with the Procurement Regulatory Authority of Zimbabwe;
6. A copy of
 - i. Company Profile indicating their physical address and directorship
 - ii. Company profile including shareholding structure.
 - iii. Certificate of Incorporation in the country of domicile.
 - iv. Completed Bid Submission form
 - v. Price Schedule and Schedule of Requirements completed in accordance with the Instructions to Bidder. No other formats for the Price Schedule and the Schedule of Requirements will be accepted. All sections to be completed
 - vi. a copy of every document necessary to demonstrate eligibility in terms of section 28 (1) of the Regulations;
 - vii. Proof of registration with PRAZ in the relevant category (S/E/003) in line with Section 4.2 of the PPDPA Regulations (S.I.5 of 2018). Supplier Registration number showing that you are registered with the Procurement Regulatory Authority of Zimbabwe.
 - viii. Three (3) copies of your proposal / bidding documents **must** be delivered to the Zimbabwe National Statistics Agency (ZIMSTAT), in Harare, Zimbabwe

- ix. Local bidders **must** be registered with the Zimbabwe Revenue Authority (ZIMRA) and **must** submit a Current Tax Clearance Certificate as proof of ZIMRA registration
 - x. Local bidders **must** be registered with the Zimbabwe Revenue Authority (ZIMRA) and **must** submit a Current VAT Clearance Certificate as proof of ZIMRA registration
 - xi. At least three reference letters indicating track record of offering similar services either from public or private organisations. Further, bidders **must** submit 3 signed and stamped authentic Reference Letters on Client's Letterhead where similar services were offered in the last 5 years
 - xii. Litigation history if any (provide a declaration on your company letterhead or provide evidence from law society confirming that you don't have any litigation/pending litigation)
 - xiii. Proof of Audited financial statements or a bank statements of not less than 6 months at the time of bidding
Bidders **must** be registered with the National Social Security Authority (NSSA) and **must** submit a valid NSSA Clearance Certificate. Failure to submit a valid NSSA Clearance Certificate will lead to automatic disqualification

You are advised to carefully read the complete Bidding Document, as well as the General Conditions of Contract which are available on the Authority's website, before preparing your Bid. Part 3: Contract is provided not for completion at this stage but to enable Bidders to note some of the Contract terms they will enter into if their Bid is successful.

The standard forms in this document may be retyped for completion but the Bidder is responsible for their accurate reproduction. All pages of the Bid must be clearly marked with the Procurement Reference Number above and the Bidder's name and any reference number.

1.2.1 Registration of Suppliers to participate in the tender procedure

Only registered suppliers will be accepted. Prospective bidders should provide proof that they are registered with PRAZ. Suppliers shall pay the following fees for them to participate in the tender procedure

1.2.2 Bid Security

A bid security of USD 500.00

The Bid Security shall be paid in any of the following;

- (i) A Certified Bank Cheque in the name of the Zimbabwe National Statistics Agency (ZIMSTAT) or
- (ii) A Bank Guarantee as per the Template attached in this bidding document (Annexure A). The undertaking by which bid security is given shall be in the format and wording set out in the bidding documents; and any other format will be considered non-responsive and rejected. or
- (iii) A cash deposit to the Procurement Regulatory Authority of Zimbabwe. Suppliers will be required to pay non-refundable establishment fees of USD 150.00 if they deposit their funds through the Procurement Regulatory Authority of Zimbabwe.
- (iv) The receipt should form part of the bid

NB: Local bidders may pay bid security using ZLW equivalent using prevailing RBZ Auction rate on the date of payment.

1.2.3 Bid Security Forfeiture

The Bid security will be forfeited in the following event;

- The bidder modifying or withdrawing his or her bid after the end of the bidding period; or

- The bidder refusing to accept a correction of an arithmetical error appearing on the face of his or her bid; or
- The successful bidder failing to sign the procurement contract in accordance with the terms set out in the bidding documents; or

The successful bidder failing to provide security for the performance of the procurement contract, if required to do so by the bidding documents

1.2.4 Contract administration fees

These are fees which should be paid by the bidder **only after being awarded the contract**. The fees will be dependent on the value of the contract awarded.

1.3 Clarifications

Queries pertaining to this bidding document should be addressed to the Procurement Management Unit, ZIMSTAT Head Office 20th Floor Kaguvi Building, Corner 4th/Central Avenue, or email pmu@zimstat.co.zw, before the closing date i.e before 8th of March 2024 at 1600 hours Zimbabwean time. Bidders who send their queries after the deadline will not be entertained. A prospective bidder requiring any clarification of the bidding documents shall notify ZIMSTAT in writing only. ZIMSTAT will respond in writing to any request for clarification of the bidding documents no later than 2 days prior to the deadline for the submission of bids. *Written copies of ZIMSTAT's responses (Including an explanation of the query) will be sent to all prospective bidders who requested the standard bidding document online. Subsequently, the same shall also be published onto ZIMSTAT Website by the 15th of March 2024. Request for clarification and the response(s) shall form part of any final contract.*

1.4 Validity of Bids

The minimum period for which the Bidder's bid must remain valid is 60 days from the deadline for the submission of bids. Failure to state Bid Validity will lead to automatic disqualification. ZIMSTAT may seek extension of bid validity before

1.6.1 Withdrawal, amendment or modification of Bids

A Bidder may withdraw, substitute, or modify its Bid after it has been submitted by sending a written notice, duly signed by an authorized representative. However, no Bid may be withdrawn, substituted, or modified in the interval between the deadline for submission of Bids and the expiration of the period of Bid validity specified by the Bidder or any extension of that period.

1.7 Delivery Requirements

The delivery period required (from the date of issuance of purchase order) and the final destination for delivery are as indicated in the Delivery Schedule in Part 2.

1.8 Bid Prices and Discounts

The prices and discounts quoted by the Bidder in the Bid Submission Form and in the Price Schedules must conform to the requirements specified below.

Prices must be quoted as specified in the Price Schedule included in Part 2 Statement of Requirements. In quoting prices, the Bidder is free to use transportation through carriers registered in any eligible country and similarly may obtain insurance services from any eligible country. Prices quoted must include the following costs and components:

- (a) For Goods
 - (i) the price of the Goods and the cost of delivery to the final destination, including the relevant INCOTERM, as stated in the Delivery Schedule;
 - (ii) the custom duties to be paid on the Goods on entry in Zimbabwe, if not already included;
 - (iii) Any other applicable import taxes;
 - (iv) any sales and other taxes due within Zimbabwe which will be payable on the Goods, if not already included;
 - (v) Any rebate or mark-up of the Domestic agent or representative.

1.9 Evaluation of Bids

The Bid will be evaluated using the following methodology:

1. Preliminary examination to confirm that all documents required have been provided, to confirm the eligibility of the Bidders in terms of section 28 (1) of the Regulations and to confirm that the Bid is administratively compliant in terms of section 28 (2) of the Regulations.

2. Technical evaluation to determine substantial responsiveness to the specifications in the Statement of Requirements;
3. Financial evaluation and comparison to determine the evaluated price of bid and to determine the lowest evaluated bid to specifications. Bidders to specifications may share the quantum of the requirements if they offer same price
4. The tender will be awarded on item basis.
5. **Bidders that are currently holding ZIMSTAT contracts and orders that are now long overdue whereas they are of similar nature to this procurement requirement, shall not be allowed to participate on this procurement procedure. In addition, all bidders who previously failed to perform any ZIMSTAT contracts shall not be considered for this particular tender. Accordingly, their bids will be automatically rejected.**

1.9.1 Evaluation criteria

The Procuring Entity's evaluation of a Bid will take into account, in addition to the Bid Price, the following criteria and methodologies.

- (a) **Delivery schedule:** The specified Goods are required to be delivered by the date indicated in the Delivery Schedule in Part 2. The bid shall be treated as non-responsive if offering delivery after the date.
- (b) Preliminary examination to confirm that all documents required have been provided, to confirm the eligibility of Bidders in terms of Section 28 (1) of the Regulations and to confirm that the Bid is administratively compliant in terms of Section 28 (2) of the Regulations :

- (c) Technical evaluation and scoring to determine substantila responsiveness to the specifications in the Statement of Requirements. Bids meeting the minimum acceptance threshold will be recommended for financial evalaution.
- (d) Financial evaluation and comparison to determine the evaluated price of bids and to determine the lowest evaluated bid.
- (e) Bids failing any stage will be leiminated and not considered in subsequent stages
- (f) ZIMSTAT resreves the right to reject unrealistic lower and exorbitant higher proces.

1.9.2 Eligibility and Qualification Criteria

The Bidder is required to meet the criteria in section 28 of the Act to be eligible to participate in public procurement and to be qualified for the proposed contract. They must therefore provide any available documentation and certify their eligibility in the Bid Submission Sheet. To be eligible, Bidders must:

1. have the legal capacity to enter into a contract;
2. not be insolvent, in receivership, bankrupt or being wound up, not have had business activities suspended and not be the subject of legal proceedings for any of these circumstances;

3. have fulfilled their obligations to pay taxes and social security contributions in Zimbabwe;
4. not have a conflict of interest in relation to this procurement requirement;
5. not be debarred from participation in public procurement under section 72 (6) of the Act and section 74(1) (c), (d) or (e) of the Regulations or declared ineligible under section 99 of the Act;
6. have the nationality of an eligible country as specified in the Special Conditions of Contract; and
7. Have been registered with the Authority as a Supplier and have paid the applicable Supplier Registration Fee set out in Part III of the Fifth Schedule to the Regulations.

1.9.3 Origin of Goods

All goods and related services must have as their country of origin an eligible country, as specified in the Special Conditions of Contract.

1.9.4 Technical Criteria

The Technical Specifications Sheet details the minimum specification of the goods required. The goods offered must meet this specification, but no credit will be given for exceeding the specification.

1.9.4.1 Brochures

Bidders must attach coloured brochures in their bids. *Failure to submit brochures or services quoted shall lead to automatic disqualification*

1.10 Currency

Bids should be priced in **USD Currency**. The currency of evaluation will be **USD**. **Accordingly, Payment shall be made using ZWL Currency using RBZ Auction Rate on the date payment.** The lowest evaluated bid, after application of any additional evaluation criteria, including any margin of preference, which is substantially responsive to the requirements of this bidding document, will be recommended for award of contract. The proposed award of contract will be by issue of a Notification of Contract Award in terms of section 55 of the Act which will be effective until signature of the contract documents in accordance with Part 3: Contract

1.10.1 Price Variation

Bidders **must** take note that this is a Fixed Sum Contract and the goods must be supplied at the contract sum. The award contract sum is final and no price increase shall be accepted.

1.10.2 Payment Terms

Bidders **must** clearly state payment terms. Payment shall be effected within 30 days after delivery of the products at the prevailing interbank market rate based on date of payment. Failure to state payment terms will lead to automatic disqualification. Bidders should note that preference will be given to Bidders with the most favourable trade finance terms.

1.10.3 Bid Prices and Discounts

Prices **must** be quoted as specified in the Price Schedule included in Part 2 Statement of Requirements. Prices quoted **must** include the following costs and components:

- I. Cost of designing of the stand
- II. Cost of construction of the stand at the ZITF Hall
- III. Cost of fix and supply furniture and equipment required in the stand
- IV. Dismantling of the stand
- V. Transport and Ancillary Services
- VI. Any sales and other taxes due within Zimbabwe which will payable on the services, if not already included
- VII. Any rebate or mark-up of the local agent or representative
- VIII. If successful, bidders that charge VAT shall be requested to produce fiscal tax invoice that is compliant to the new ZIMSRA TARMS systeme requirements

1.11 Premises Inspection

ZIMSTAT reserves the right to inspect the bidder's operating premises to verify capacity to undertake the project (warehouse and offices inspections). ZIMSTAT may disqualify a bidder if the premises fail to meet required standards as per its vendor verification checklist. Bidders must submit physical address or their operating premises.

1.12 Right to Reject

The Procuring Entity reserves the right to accept or reject any Bid or to cancel the procurement process and reject all Bids at any time prior to contract award.

1.13 Corrupt Practices

The Government of Zimbabwe requires that Procuring Entities, as well as Bidders and Contractors, observe the highest standard of ethics during the procurement and execution of contracts. In pursuit of this policy:

1. the Procuring Entity will reject a recommendation for award if it determines that the Bidder recommended for award has, directly or through an agent, engaged in corrupt, fraudulent, collusive or coercive practices in competing for the Contract or been declared ineligible to be awarded a procurement contract under section 99 of the Act;
2. the Authority may under section 72 (6) of the Act impose the sanctions under section 74 (1) of the Regulations; and
3. Any conflict of interest on the part of the Bidder must be declared.
