USD PRODUCER PRICE INDEX NON-AGRICULTURE JUNE 2026 (JANUARY 2023=100)

USD Producer Price Index

The USD Producer Price Index (PPI) excluding agriculture was **114.68** in June 2026 and **113.63** in May 2026.

Month-on-Month Rate of Change

The month-on-month rate of change in June 2026 was **0.9** percent, gaining 0.1 percentage points on the May 2026 rate of **0.8** percent.

This means that prices as measured by the all-items USD PPI, increased by an average of 0.9 percent from May 2026 to June 2026.

The month-on-month rate of change is given by the percentage change in the price index of the reference month compared with the index of the previous month.

Manufacture of other food products, quarrying of stone, sand and clay, Mining and quarrying n.e.c., Distilling, rectifying and blending of spirits and Manufacture of basic chemicals, fertilisers and nitrogen compounds, plastics and synthetic rubber in primary forms contributed to the increase of the index.

Manufacture of pharmaceuticals, medicinal chemical and botanical products, Manufacture of dairy products, Manufacture of other chemical products, manufacture of batteries and accumulators, Processing and preserving of meat, Processing and preserving of fish, crustaceans and molluscs, Manufacture of basic iron and steel and Manufacture of other fabricated metal products; metalworking service activities did not contribute to the rise or decrease of the index.

Year-on-Year Rate of Change

The year-on-year rate of change in June 2026 was **3.4** percent.

This means that prices as measured by the all-items USD PPI, increased by an average rate of **3.4** percent from June 2025 to June 2026.

The year-on-year rate of change is given by the percentage change in the index of the reference month of the current year compared with the index of the same month in the previous year.

Methodology

The USD Producer Price Index (PPI) is obtained by comparing price changes of goods and services in USD.

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
