## Executive Summary

This report presents road, air, rail and inland water transport statistics for 4<sup>th</sup> quarter 2025. The statistics were compiled using administrative data obtained from the Zimbabwe Republic Police Statistics Department and relevant institutions under the Ministry of Transport and Infrastructural Development.

The number of light vehicles (up to 2,300kg) registered in the country for the first time during 4<sup>th</sup> quarter 2025 increased by **18.4** percent, from **16,654** registered in 3<sup>rd</sup> quarter 2025 to **19,715**.

A total of **16,237** road traffic accidents were reported in 4<sup>th</sup> quarter 2025, translating to a **5.7** percent increase from **15,443** accidents reported during the preceding quarter. Resultantly, the number of deaths recorded from the reported accidents rose by **8.9** percent, from **637** in 3<sup>rd</sup> Quarter 2025 to **694**.

For the quarter under review, a total of **17,660** flights were recorded, marking a decrease of **12.1** percent, compared to **20,099** in the preceding quarter. Accordingly, the total number of air passengers decreased by **2.4** percent, from **714,278** to **696,983**.

There was a **12.1** percent decrease in freight transported by air, from **4,047** tonnes in 3<sup>rd</sup> quarter 2025 to **3,558** tonnes during 4<sup>th</sup> quarter 2025. Inbound freight increased by **3.7** percent while outbound freight decreased by **31.8** percent.

Compared to the preceding quarter, the total tonnage of goods transported by rail decreased by **21.5** percent during 4<sup>th</sup> quarter 2025, from **670,196** tonnes to **526,292** tonnes.

# 1 Introduction

This report presents road, air, rail and inland water transport statistics for 4<sup>th</sup> quarter 2025. The statistics were compiled using administrative data obtained from the Zimbabwe Republic Police Statistics Department and relevant institutions under the Ministry of Transport and Infrastructural Development.

## 2 Road Transport

### 2.1 Vehicles Registered for the First Time

The number of light vehicles (up to 2,300kg) registered for the first time during 4<sup>th</sup> quarter 2025 was **19,715**, reflecting a **18.4** percent increase from **16,654** registered in third quarter 2025. (Table 2.1)

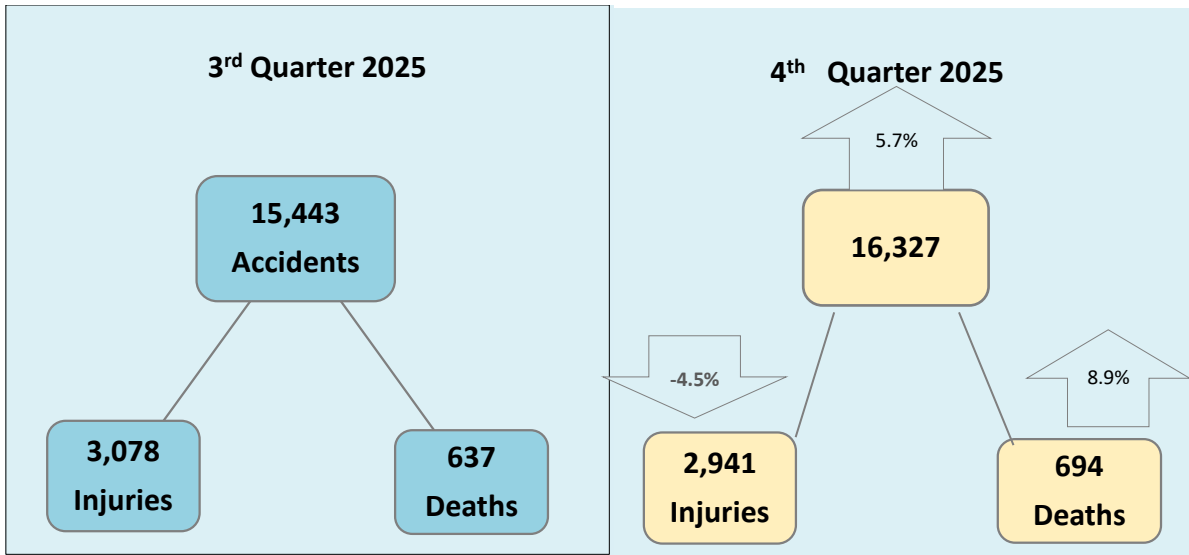

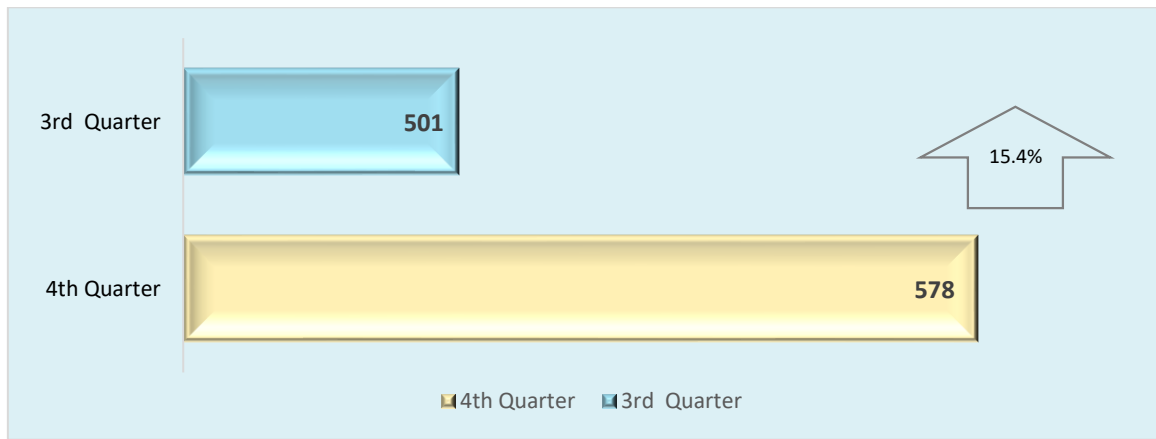

### 2.2 Road Traffic Accidents

A total of **16,327** road traffic accidents were reported in 4<sup>th</sup> quarter 2025, representing a **5.7** percent increase from **15,443** accidents reported during the 3<sup>rd</sup> quarter of 2025. Consequently, the number of deaths resulting from the reported road traffic accidents went up by **8.9** percent, from **637** to **694**. The number of fatal accidents also increased by **15.4** percent from **501** in 3<sup>rd</sup> quarter 2025 to **578** during the quarter under review. (Figures 2.1 and 2.2)

### 2.3 Driver’s License.

The proportion of successful candidates for the Certificate of Competency test gained **0.5** percentage points, from **55.8** percent to **56.3** percent in fourth quarter 2025, when compared to the preceding quarter, **(Figure 2.3)**

Harare province recorded the highest proportion (**69.1%**) of candidates who passed the Certificate of Competence test in 4<sup>th</sup> quarter 2025, followed by Mashonaland East Province, which recorded **65.6** percent. (Table 2.3)

### 3 Air Transport

#### 3.1 Flights and Air Passenger Movement (excluding military flights)

There was a **12.1** percent decrease in the number of flights, from **17,560** recorded during 4<sup>th</sup> quarter 2025, compared to **20,099** in the preceding quarter. Resultantly, the total number of air passengers in 4<sup>th</sup> quarter 2025 decreased by **2.4** percent to **696,983** from **714,278**. Joshua Mqabuko Nkomo and Robert Gabriel Mugabe International Airports recorded increases in both number of flights and air passengers, while Victoria Falls International Airport and Other airports recorded decreases during the 4<sup>th</sup> quarter of 2025 compared to the 3<sup>rd</sup> quarter. 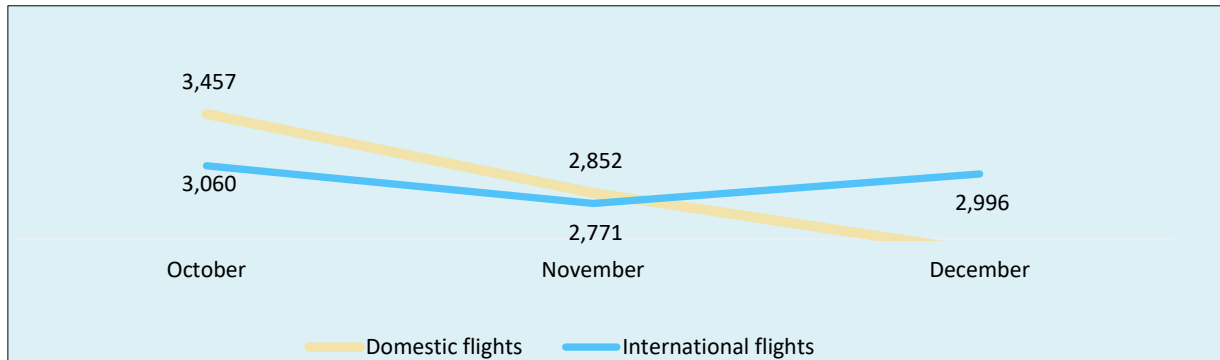

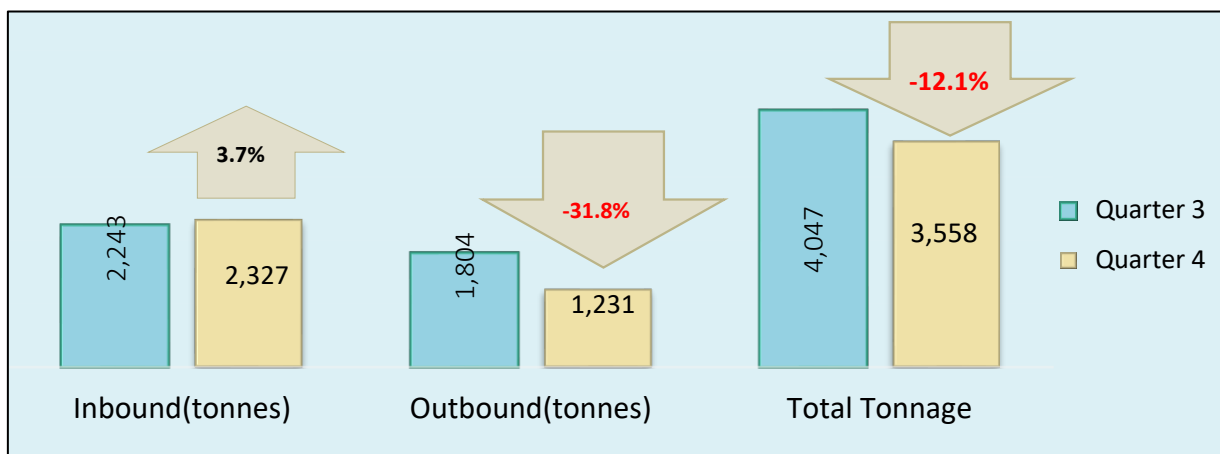


**Figure 3.1: Domestic and International Flights, 4<sup>th</sup> Quarter 2025**

Domestic flights remained on a downward trajectory, reaching a low of **2,996** in December 2025, from **3,457** in October 2025. International flights fluctuated from a peak of **3,060** in October 2025 to **2,771** in November 2025, rising again to **2,996** in December 2025. **(Figure 3.1)**

### 3.2 Air freight

There was a **12.1** percent decrease in air freight during 4<sup>th</sup> quarter 2025, from **4,047** tonnes recorded in 3<sup>rd</sup> quarter 2025 to **3,558** tonnes. Inbound freight increased by **3.7** percent while outbound freight decreased by **31.8** percent. **(Figure 3.4)**

## 4 Inland Water Transport

The number of newly registered vessels decreased by **39.5%**, from **81** recorded in 3<sup>rd</sup> quarter 2025 to **49** in 4<sup>th</sup> quarter 2025. During the same period, the numbers of permits and licenses issued decreased by **8.3** percent and **41.8** percent, respectively. **(Table 4.1)**

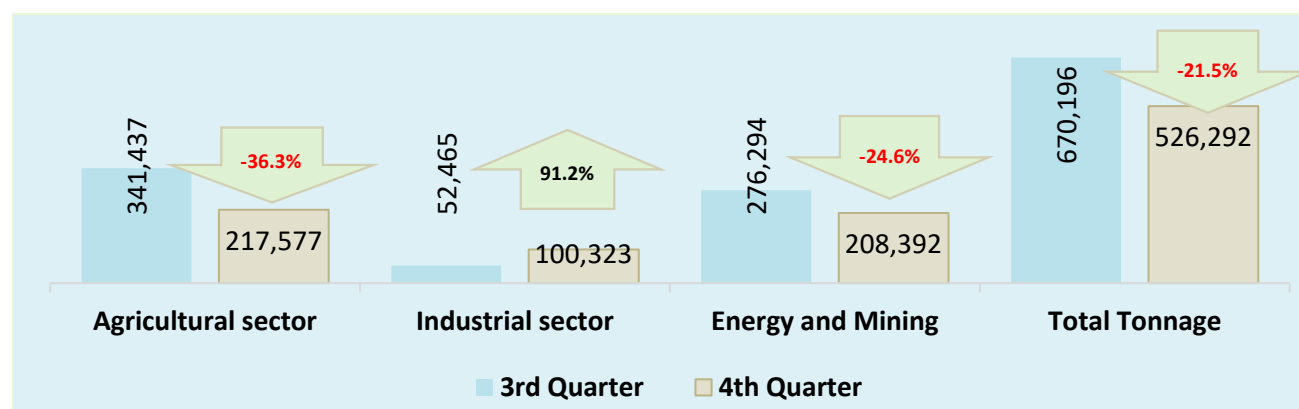

## 5 Rail Transport

### 5.1 Rail Transport Tonnage

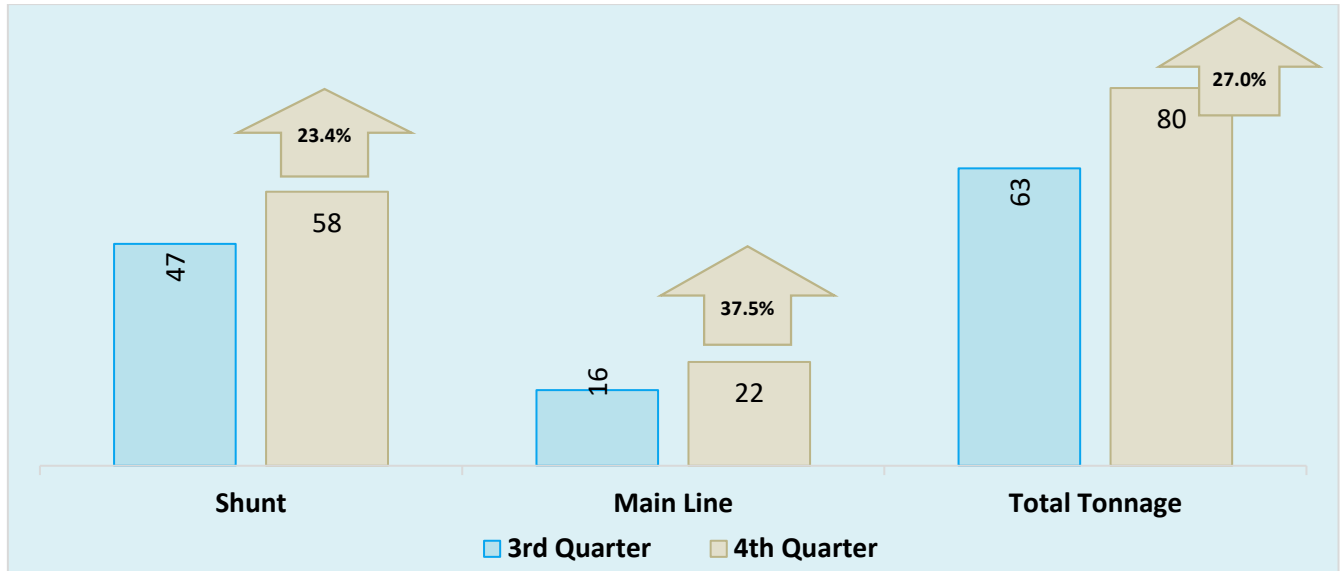


**Figure 5.1: Railway Tonnage by Sector where Service was rendered, 4<sup>th</sup> Quarter 2025**

Compared to the preceding quarter, total tonnage of goods transported by rail decreased by **21.5** percent during 4<sup>th</sup> quarter 2025, from **670,196** tonnes to **526,292** tonnes. Goods transported (in tonnes) for the *Industrial Sector* increased by **91.2** percent, while those for the *Agricultural* and *Energy & Mining* Sectors dropped by **36.3** percent and **24.6** percent, respectively. **(Figure 5.1)**

## 5.2 Rail Traffic Accidents<sup>2</sup>

A total of **80** rail traffic accidents were reported in 4<sup>th</sup> quarter 2025, representing a **27.0** percent increase when compared to **63** accidents recorded in the preceding quarter. Main line accidents increased by **37.5** percent from **16** recorded in the preceding quarter to **22** during the quarter under review, while shunt accidents increased by **23.4** percent. **(Figure 5.2)**
