Introduction

- The 2022 Population and Housing Census(PHC) collected data on fertility which is a key driver of population change along side mortality and migration;
- The 2022 PHC collected data for women 10-49 years;
- Fertility information for women 10-14 years was collected to assess the fertility trends and child marriages for this age group at in-depth analysis stage; and
- The 2022 Population and Housing Census Preliminary results focused on fertility analysis for women aged 15-49.

Importance of Fertility Statistics

- Policy formulation and evaluation;
- Effective planning and resource allocation;
- Assisting in projecting demand for social services; and
- Monitoring of regional and international obligations such as Agenda 2063 and the Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs).

Fertility Preliminary Results

Crude Birth Rate (CBR) by Province

A total of **435,735** live births were reported in the last 12 months preceding the census.

At national level, crude birth rate was 28.7 live births per 1,000 population.

Mash Central: 32.7 Mash West: 32.0

Mat North: **25.4** Bulawayo: **21.6**.

In 2012 the CBR was **31.9**

General Fertility Rate (GFR) by Province

At national level, GFR was 114 live births per 1,000 women.


Mash Central: 137

Mash West: 128

Harare: 91

Bulawayo: 73


In 2012, the GFR was 127 live births per 1,000 women.



Age Specific Fertility Rates (ASFR) by Age Group


ASFR was highest at 178.4 live births per 1,000 women in the 20–24 year age group.

ASFR was lowest at **7.4 live births per 1,000 women** in the 45-49 age group.




Age Specific Fertility Rates (ASFR) by Rural/Urban Areas and Age Group

ASFR was higher rural areas compared to urban areas. In rural areas, fertility peaked, at **212 live** births 1,000 per women in the 20–24 year age group, urban areas, peaked, at 144.7 live births 1,000 per women in the 25-29 year age group.




Total Fertility Rate (TFR) by Province

At the national level, TFR was **3.7 children per woman**. Mash Central: **4.4**; Manicaland: **4.2**; Mat North: **3.6**; Mat South: **3.5**; Harare: **2.9**; Bulawayo: **2.4**. In 2012, the TFR was **3.8 children per woman**



Total Fertility Rate by Rural/Urban Areas

TFR was higher in rural areas **4.2 children per woman** compared to urban areas **2.8 children per woman**.




Median Age at First Live Birth by Rural/Urban Areas

At a national level, median age at first live birth was **20 years**.

In Rural areas, the median age at first live birth was 19 years while in urban areas 21 years.


In 2012 at national level, the median age at first live birth was **21 years**



Median Age at First Live Birth by Province

The lowest median age at first live birth (19 years) was recorded in Mash Central, Mash West, Mat North and Mat South provinces.


The highest median age at first live birth of **21** was in Harare and Bulawayo provinces.



Proportion of Women Aged 20–24 Years who got Married before Age 15 by Rural/Urban Areas

At national level, **1.0%** of the women aged 20–24 years, got married before attaining age 15.

The proportion was higher at 1.6% in rural areas compared to urban areas at 0.3%.




Proportion of Women Aged 20 – 24 who got Married before Age 15 by Province

Mashonaland Central had the highest proportion of women who got married before attaining the age of 15; 2.2%

Mash West: 1.8% Manicaland: 1.7%

Harare: 0.3%


Bulawayo: 0.1%



Proportion of Women Aged 20–24 who got Married before Age 18 by Rural/Urban Areas

At a national level, **16.2%** of the women aged 20–24 years, got married before attaining 18 years.

The proportion was 22.7% in rural areas and 7.2% in urban areas.




Proportion of Women Aged 20–24 Years who got Married before Age 18 by Province

Mashonaland Central had the highest proportion of 28.8% of women who got married before age of 18.

Mash West: 22.8% Manicaland: 21.4%


Harare: **7.7%**

Bulawayo: 2.6%



Infant Birth Registration by Rural/Urban Areas

At national level **19.1%** (84,419) births were registered for infants. Birth registration for infants was **28.3%** (45,982) for urban areas and **13.7%** (38,437) for rural areas.



Infant Registered Births by Province


Proportion of registered births was:

Masvingo: **35.1%**

Bulawayo: **27.9%**

Harare: **15.2%**

Mash Central: 14.7%
